Co-Impact's First Diversity Conference

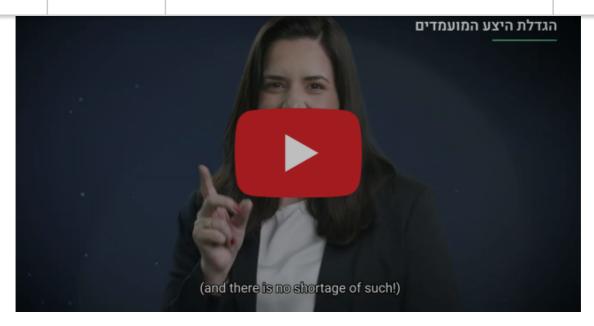

The Co-Impact annual Mentoring conference was held on June 8th in 'OpenValley' offices, in the Caesaria Industrial Complex, which offers shared working space for technological projects to get started, grow and develop. This event was the third of its kind and was attended by about 100 mentors and mentees who have been paired over the years. The conference was opened by Adv. Zaki Diab, Board member and Chairman of the Mentoring Program, Nawa Jahshan Batshon, CEO of Co-Impact, and Shira Meltzer, Business Leadership and Mentoring Manager at Co-Impact.

The Mentoring Pairs (mentor-mentee) are Jewish and Arab, and the mentoring relationship expands employment opportunities, offers social and professional networking, and managerial guidance. In addition to the practical tools gained through the mentoring program, the participants are engaged into a learning process, enabling them to cope with challenges along the way, and seize job opportunities.

the Globes Newspaper; considered pioneers in their field - Ali Ayoub - senior director of software engineering at NVIDIA, Doaa Kaabiya - director of financial welfare programs at the Joint, Firas Kazmouz - CEO of Dabah stores and Ahmad Muhana -Executive Director of Qudra, the Arab Philanthropists Network.

Zaki Diab, opened the conference with the vision he had for Co-Impact's mentoring program. "As a Young lawyer from Arab society, with no social or professional network, I found myself sending dozens of resumes to law firms in hopes of finding a job in my profession. After a long and tedious process that initially yielded no results, I realized I needed a mentor who knew the business system, how it works, who knew how to guide me, who I needed to get to know, what else awaits me on the way to joining a law firm. I got acquainted with the concept of mentoring while still studying in the United States and I realized that this was the perfect way to expose young Arab professionals to jobs that are right for us. That is how the idea for Co-Impact's mentoring program was born."

Firas Kazmouz: "I am glad that there are events such as these, I don't hear of many such events, it is critical to the promotion of Arab society in the coming years. There is no shortage of talents in Arab society, only a lack of guidance - without trust and cooperation, we will not be able to advance as a Society."



Ali Ayoub: "I am very excited to be in a place where there are mentors and mentees who help each other to promote young people especially from Arab Society. It is not obvious that mentors volunteer from all
